The **Florida Highwaymen** featured at City Hall exhibit beginning Jan. 8, 2024 A capsule collection of Florida Highwaymen paintings will be showcased in the cultural heritage exhibit in the City Hall atrium, 1565 First Street, beginning Monday, Jan. 8, 2024. For more information go to: <u>City of Sarasota News</u> If you're hosting ambassadors and have some free time, this is an excellent place to visit.

European Travel Information and Authorization System or ETIAS. With the arrival of ETIAS expected in 2025, passport holders of 59 of the 62 countries that currently travel visa-free, will require an ETIAS waiver to travel to Europe for the purposes of tourism, business, or transit for a 90 days stay in any 180-day period, this includes the US.

ETIAS implementation is now delayed until at least **2025**. Designed to strengthen the security of the Schengen Area, the ETIAS will offer a way for Member States to pre-screen prospective visitors before they enter the region. https://etias.com/what-is-etias/who-needs-etias for updated information.
